## **Scavenger Hunt**

<b>Explore</b> the <u>exhibition</u> . <b>Describe</b> and <b>draw</b> details of something that surprises you.	Find the large sculpture with draped fabric.  Write three words to describe the materials you see.	Find the wall with fabric protest banners. Each banner was made by Aram Han Sifuentes or participants in her banner- making workshops.  Consider what you stand for or against. If you were to make a banner, what would it say?
Focus on an artwork and imagine it were a song. If each color, texture, shape, and material were a different sound or instrument, what might they be? Look for relationships between artworks in the exhibition—such as similar imagery, colors, ideas, or materials. Draw or photograph what you find.	With a partner, <b>select</b> an <u>artwork</u> to focus on. <b>Describe</b> what you see or hear. How are elements in the artwork arranged? <b>Discuss</b> how the artwork makes you feel.  What do you <b>think</b> the work might be about based on your observations?
